#### 6. Financial matters

Report from FSC Meeting on 26th May 2021

The first part of the meeting was spent in the company of Llanrug Community Council officers, who had come to explain their system for recording Cemetery details electronically.

A presentation was given on Llanrug Community Council's electronic recording system which was certainly an eye opener and possibly the way forward in terms of modernising the system of recording funerals/graves in the future.

There was no certainty whether the system would remove the need for the existing written records which could therefore mean adding to the recording work rather than reducing it.

# As a result it was agreed to keep the system in mind but not to proceed until there was further clarity

Financial balance sheet – The financial balance sheet was shared on screen showing £44,664.53 in the Current Account following receipt of the first half of the Precept and £25,037.81. It was recommended to transfer £10K to the Deposit Account to pay for the additional work at the new centre. Agreed.

# 8. Planning

a. Planning Application C21/0485/25/LL Location: Hafod y Nant, Rhydygroes, Pentir, Bangor, LL57 4YA Proposal: Erection of an agricultural shed for use to shelter livestock, storing fodder

and machinery together with an ancillary workshop. There was considerable discussion about the plan due to the fact that the applicant does not farm and owns heavy machinery on another site. **Object**.

Planning Application C21/0536/25/DT Location: 3 Bro Infryn, Glasinfryn, Bangor, LL574UR
Proposal Demolish existing rear extension and erect a 2 storey extension in its place. No objection.

- > Insurance Arranged through Hiscox insurance company for 2021-22.
- Pentir Defibrillator Cllr J Lewis did not take part in this discussion Last year, it was agreed that Pentir Council would undertake to install a Defibrillator in the kiosk when Parchu Pentir's agreement came to an end. That had happened without much notice and therefore, the matter had to be dealt with promptly.
  - It was agreed to purchase and install 1 new machine • Defibrillators 2021-22 Locations had not been identified at present to order more.
    - Although the Goetre Uchaf Estate had been identified, the roads had not currently been adopted and therefore it remained a private estate.
- Wildflowers Seeds have been sown
- Septic Tank A specialist had visited and designed a system that would meet the needs of Welsh Water.
- Risk Assessment The Clerk needs to share the register electronically so that everyone has the opportunity to look at it and identify how to address some of the actions noted in red and reduce that particular risk
